Malaysian Internet Censorship is Going from Bad to Worse

Following our <u>previous articles</u> about increasing political censorship of the Internet in Malaysia, things have quickly gone from bad to worse. In fact since July 2015, the Malaysian government has blocked at least ten websites, including online news portals and private blogs, for reporting about the scandal surrounding Malaysian Prime Minister Najib tun Razak over his mysterious private dealings with \$700 million in funds.




Among the latest developments include the state's blocking of online news portal, <u>The Malaysian Insider</u>, due to their reporting on the scandal—a blatant act of press censorship which <u>drew official comment</u> from the U.S. Department of State. Local activist Fahmi Reza has also <u>come under investigation</u> for his parody clown images depicting the Prime Minister posted to his <u>Twitter account</u>.

And the Malaysian government still clamors for more censorship authority, adding to its existing broad powers under the Penal Code and the Sedition Act. Currently, the government is planning to table the amendments to both the Official Secret Act (OSA) and the Communication & Multimedia Act (CMA) during its upcoming March or May Parliamentary sessions, to strengthen its control over content providers, Internet Service Providers (ISPs), and end users.

Fahmi Reza gets jail, fined RM30,000 over clown caricature

IPOH: A freelance graphic artist was sentenced to a month's jail and fined RM30,000 by the Sessions Court here today for uploading a clown sketch of the prime minister on his Facebook account two years ago.

Bernama reported that Judge Norashima Khalid handed down the sentence on Mohd Fahmi Reza Mohd Zarin, 40, after finding that the defence had failed to raise reasonable doubt against the prosecution's case at the end of the defence case.

However, it said the court allowed a stay of the sentence pending an appeal in the High Court and Fahmi was allowed bail of RM10,000 with one surety.

On June 10, 2016, Fahmi was charged under Section 233(1)(a) of the Communications and Multimedia Act with posting a poster depicting Datuk Seri Najib Razak in clown face along with the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC) logo.

He was accused of posting the image on his Facebook page on Feb 8, 2016 at Seraya Sdn Bhd, Batu 3, Jalan Jelapang here.

Reuters reported Fahmi was found guilty for spreading online content deemed "obscene, indecent, false, menacing or offensive in character with intent to annoy, abuse, threaten or harass another person".

He also faced a second similar charge in a separate court.


It was reported that deputy public prosecutors Mohd Sophian Zakaria and Nazrul Nizam Zameri from the MCMC prosecuted, while Fahmi was represented by counsel Syahredzuan Johan.

Earlier in mitigation, Syahredzuan asked the court to impose a fine of RM10,000 as it was his client's first offence.



M'sia sees biggest mobile data breach

PETALING JAYA: The personal details of some 46.2 million mobile number subscribers in Malaysia are at stake in what is believed to be one of the largest data breaches ever seen in the country.

By Royce Tan and Sharmila Nair From home addresses and MyKad numbers to SIM card information, the private details of almost the entire population may have fallen into the wrong hands.


Malaysia's population is only around 32 million, but many have several mobile numbers. The list is also believed to include inactive numbers and temporary ones bought by visiting foreigners.

With this leak, Malaysians may be vulnerable to social engineering attacks and in a worst-case scenario, phones may be cloned.

It is also said that 81,309 records from the Malaysian Medical Council, Malaysian Medical Association (MMA) and Malaysian Dental Association were also leaked.
